Snow Removal Heroes

Many thanks to those who were patient while Town crews expended near super-human effort to clear streets and walkways following the record dumps of snow we had this winter. Although the Town strives for excellence in providing services to our community, we are still subject to the whims of nature, budgetary constraints, and limitations of human and mechanical endurance.

Gratitude and sincere appreciation go out to staff from Public Works, Utilities, and local contractors for their snow removal efforts through December and January. A crew of less than 10 staff members worked in shifts from about 3:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., sometimes going as many as 17 hours a day or more! They followed a route plan focusing on areas of town section by section, moving as quickly and efficiently as the conditions allowed. This, on top of their regular duties! Amazing effort by an amazing team. Thank you so very much to each of you.

Residents can help: Property owners must keep the public walk adjacent to their property cleared (do not shovel it onto the street), and keep the space around any fire hydrants in front of their property clear of snow and other obstructions (two meters on each side and in front of the hydrant, and one meter at the back). When the results were confirmed following the 2025 Municipal Election this past October, the six candidates in the running for Town Council were acclaimed, including two new candidates who joined the Council team, replacing two former councillors who chose not to run in this election.

Councillor David (Dave) Pacholok: Returning as a third-term councillor, Dave is pleased to be a member of the 2025-2029 Town Council team.

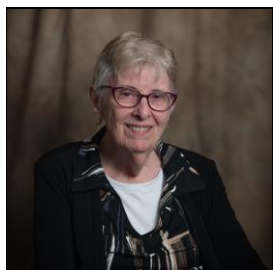
With the benefit of the experience gained in his prior eight years on Council, he looks forward to having some of the previous Council initiatives come to fruition.

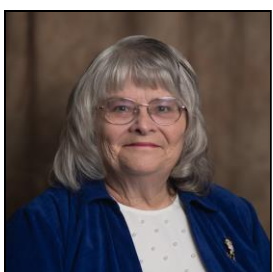
