Municipal elections are held every four years in municipalities throughout Alberta. This gives interested individuals an opportunity to vie for a spot on their local municipal council, and provides residents with the opportunity to have a say in who gets elected.

When the results were announced following the 2021 Municipal Election this past October, a few new members were elected to the Athabasca Town Council team, replacing a few former councillors who chose not to run in this election.

With immediate past Mayor Colleen Powell announcing her retirement from Council, 2017-2021 Councillor Rob Balay threw his hat into the ring for the Mayor's chair and successfully won the seat for the 2021-2025 term.

Returning to Council for another term are Councillors Ida Edwards and David (Dave) Pacholok.

Newly welcomed to Council for this term are Councillors Sara Graling, Jon LeMessurier, Loretta Prosser and Edith (Edie) Yuill.
