## Municipal Election 2025 Update

Municipal Elections take place in communities throughout Alberta on Oct. 20, 2025. For the Town of Athabasca, nominations closed at noon on Sept. 22 and were [confirmed the afternoon of Sept. 23](#).

Seven candidates initially came forward for Town Council, but with one withdrawal, six candidates remained. As a result, they have been **acclaimed**. *Congratulations to our new Council members who will serve for the next four-year term!*

Institutional Polls will take place on Election Day, Oct. 20. Election Staff will visit Pleasant Valley Lodge, Athabasca Extendicare, and Long-Term Care at the Athabasca Healthcare Centre (hospital). Times will be arranged with facility staff. Institutional Polls are for residents of the institutions only, not for the general public.

The swearing in of the new Council and the Council Organizational meeting will take place at 6:00 p.m. on Oct. 28. Members of the public are welcome to attend.

Council member orientation is scheduled for Nov. 3. Councillors serve a four-year term.

## Appreciation for Town Council

Athabasca has benefitted from the leadership of an attentive and active complement of Town Councillors through the 2021-2025 council term and they deserve to be acknowledged and thanked for their efforts and commitment.

Following the results of Nomination Day, Councillors Ida Edwards, David Pacholok, Darlene Reimer and Edith Yuill will be returning by acclamation. Mayor Rob Balay will face one challenger in the Mayoral election. Councillor Sara Graling did not submit a nomination, thus will be leaving council. Councillor Jon LeMessurier, although initially planning to run, resigned in late August due to Municipal Government Act regulations requiring Town Councillors to live in town – Jon has moved his family to the family acreage south of town where he grew up.

The duties of a Councillor can be demanding and their efforts often underrated because much of what they do can happen behind the scenes or in incremental steps. However, looking back over the past four years, members of Town Council have been productive, with many examples of community engagement, agreements with regional and provincial partners, collaborative efforts with groups and organizations, and more, all for the purpose of helping make Athabasca a great community. A few examples include:

- Passing the Land Acknowledgement statement, read at the start of Town meetings and events, and posted on the Town website, Town newsletter and elsewhere.
- A successful lobby effort that included the return of Athabasca University convocation ceremonies to Athabasca, and protections of regional employment indoctrinated into the Investment Management Agreement.

- Efforts of the Regional Health Care Attraction & Retention Committee: a transition house, and recruitment of two new doctors and one nurse practitioner.
- Annual Council Appreciation Dinner recognizing community volunteers, groups and organizations, with special recognition for Town staff and the Athabasca Fire Department.
- Community Standards Bylaw
- Residential and non-residential tax incentives
- Implementation of the Downtown Revitalization Program: a one-time, 50% matching, reimbursement grant of up to \$5,000.00 per premise (for the storefront).
- Municipal agreement between the five municipalities along the Athabasca Landing Trail – the Trail will be 150 years old in 2026! (Town of Athabasca, Athabasca County, Westlock County, Sturgeon County and Town of Gibbons)
- The Town's support of various riverfront projects, the newest one being the Rotary Riverfront Shade Pavilion project. Also, the designation of the [Athabasca Riverfront as an Historic Place](#); a result of the application submitted by the Athabasca Heritage Society.

## News and Notes

**TOWN STAFF AWARDS:** Congratulations to Graeme Douglas, Public Works Superintendent, for Five Years of service with the Town! And Congratulations to Town CAO Rachel Ramey for reaching the 20-year mark! What an amazing milestone! Rachel began working with the Town in 2005 as the Municipal Information Services Officer. In 2013, she took on the role of Development Officer, and in 2017, the role of Assistant CAO. In 2020, she was appointed to the role of Town CAO.

**SOLD – GRAND UNION HOTEL SITE:** In July 2024, after standing as a community landmark for more than a century, the historic Grand Union Hotel caught fire and was reduced to rubble in a matter of hours. Recently, new owners assumed responsibility for the property and are expected to complete the site remediation process.

**TOWN COUNCIL RETREAT:** Members of Town Council typically meet for a Council Retreat in October or November each year to discuss the Town's strategic and operational plans for the upcoming year. This year's retreat will include a review of the Town Budget, Strategic Plan, and other significant items that require particular focus and consideration.

**GEOSPACIAL INFORMATION SYSTEM (GIS):** This online resource has proven to be a very [useful visual tool](#) that is being used regularly by Town staff. Photo-mapping is done by air, then municipalities can access customizable geographic details for property insights, asset reporting, tax information, and more.

For example, the Town has all of their water and wastewater lines in the system, and uses it for asset management and property development purposes, as well. Lot line measurements are definitely a useful tool; however, since the mapping is done by air, the line locations may not be completely accurate.

While staff of a municipality can log in to the site and access more features than are available to the general public, members of the public can still access the Town of Athabasca GIS as a guest to get some insight into how the mapping system works. Once on the Town of Athabasca page, you can zoom in, scroll around and click sections for more info about a specific property. Visit the [Town Interactive Map](#) page for access and directions on how to use this interesting resource.

**OFF-SEASON PARKING BYLAW:** [Town Land Use Bylaw 010-2025](#), Section 8.15, states, in part, that, in a Residential District, a Recreational Vehicle shall not be kept in any part of a front yard, or a side yard adjacent to a road, between Nov. 1 and March 31. Please review the bylaw, available on the Town website, for complete guidelines regarding RV parking.
